

## Regional Emergency Medicine CT3 Teaching Programme

August 2023 – 2024

The third year of training (ACCS CT3 EM) focuses on Paediatric Emergencies, and consolidation of the presentations experienced in years one and two. Trainees will normally be expected to have completed **FRCEM primary** before entering the CT3 year and must pass **FRCEM intermediate** by the end of CT3.

The Teaching Programme will be delivered between

- Leicester Royal Infirmary Emergency Department
- Queens Medical Centre Emergency Department Nottingham
- Royal Derby Hospital Emergency Department

This will address the core learning needs that the trainees have with respect to–

- Gaining competencies that are difficult to deliver on the shop floor
- Progression in the **FRCEM examinations**
- Consolidation of CT1 and CT2 experience

Teaching will be learner led or directed with senior/specialist input/supervision provided into its delivery on the day of teaching. Trainee coordinators will be expected to meet up with the Supervisor/Facilitator 3 weeks prior to the session.

You will be released for the whole day for teaching, the first half of the day is self-directed but you will be expected to have completed all of the tasks on the EM3 section of the HEEM Moodle (in the School of Emergency Medicine section) prior to attending the teaching session. This is achieved by spreading it out over the month in preparation for the afternoon session (1400-1700). You will be expected to bring completed certificates of this to the afternoon session.

### Teaching rules:

- If you are not on AL then you must attend teaching
- Face to Face Teaching will be monthly (see timetable below)
- Face to face attendance and your activity on the HEEM Moodle will be recorded and fed back to your Clinical and Educational Supervisor
- Please reflect on the ED CT3 teaching sessions, complete the feedback forms on Moodle and make an entry into your e portfolio
- Please liaise with the Consultant 3 weeks before to ensure good quality educational content and planning of the session.
- Please get the supervising Consultant to complete the teaching assessment tool on your e-Portfolio if you are delivering the teaching session
