East Midlands ACCS Teaching Programme

August 2023 - July 2025

Introduction:

Acute Care Common Stem (ACCS) core training is a two-year period which comprises formal training in Anaesthesia, Emergency Medicine, General Internal Medicine (Acute Medicine) and Intensive Care Medicine. The ACCS curriculum is based on the training curricula for these four specialties.

ACCS EM trainees go on to do a further CT3 year in Emergency Medicine/Paediatric Emergency Medicine. At the end of the CT2 year Acute Medicine and Anaesthetics track trainees rotate into core training programmes in their respective specialities.

The teaching programme is aimed at cross speciality ACCS trainees. There is agreement in the ACCS board to release ACCS trainees in all departments to attend teaching. The ACCS Teaching Programme is based on the range of competencies as identified in the January 2021 ACCS Curriculum.

Teaching topics:

The ACCS curriculum provides a comprehensive list of underpinning knowledge, technical skills and non-technical (behavioural) skills, grouped together into broad subject areas. Those considered relevant to ACCS core training are listed in the table. Although a wide range of teaching and learning environments are used to develop competences across these topic areas, the aim of the ACCS Teaching Programme is to provide a monthly topic-focused group teaching opportunity for ACCS trainees to support their training and development within the ACCS programme.

Teaching programme:

Each ACCS Group Teaching Programme Session is led by a Consultant. The programme comprises a series of 3 hour group teaching sessions which take place between 1 and 4 pm on Tuesday afternoons once a month across teaching hospitals in the east midlands (south). Due to COVID 19 related restrictions, this will be done, as much as possible, using remote working platforms.

Each session is based on the specific objectives and competences related to ACCS training and as defined in (and limited by) the 2021 ACCS Curriculum. Each group teaching session will provide:

- A contextual overview of the underpinning knowledge, technical skills and non-technical (behavioural) skills relevant to that ACCS topic area
- A framework for learning and study
- A reminder of the required competences and how they can be achieved and demonstrated a discussion of any particularly complex or difficult aspects within the topic area.

Teaching Rules:

You will be expected to have completed all of the tasks on the ACCS EM3 section or another sign-posted learning resource prior to attending the face to face teaching session.

- If you are not on AL then you must attend teaching. Please ensure you book study leave on the LETB system for this.
- Face to Face Teaching (on virtual platforms) will be from 1-4pm monthly (see timetable below). This will be recorded for you ES and TPD
- Please reflect on the ACCS teaching sessions, complete the feedback forms on EM3 and make an entry into your e portfolio
- If you are delivering teaching-You must liaise with the supervising Consultant 3 weeks before to ensure good quality educational content and planning of the session.
- Please get the supervising Consultant to complete the teaching assessment tool on your ePortfolio or on paper if you are delivering the teaching session
