Notes on Regional Teaching

- Teaching is on the 3rd Tuesday of every month.
- Attendance at regional teaching for all ST4s, ST5s and pre-FRCEM ST6s is mandatory
 unless you are on annual leave (except induction, which is for ST4s only). You should
 keep a record of attendance with a reflection on your ePortfolio for each day you
 attend.
- The regional teaching programme is designed to cover a significant proportion of the curriculum, rolling over a two-year period. Some sessions are more focused on FRCEM preparation, such as the annual mock OSCE day and the FRCEM SBA session.
- The key SLOs are identified for each session so please be guided on teaching session content by the relevant section of the RCEM curriculum (see link <u>Home Page -</u> RCEMCurriculum).
- Format for the teaching is topic dependent and will be decided by the College Tutor
 at the site running the teaching, in conjunction with the TPD as/if required. Use of
 various modalities of teaching have received very good feedback previously. Some
 days lend themselves far better to face to face delivery, and others may work equally
 well as virtual/hybrid sessions.
- Days that have a clinical theme will include other aspects of the curriculum also (e.g. medico-legal dilemmas, leadership aspects). Certain days will require preparatory work prior to them and the use of EDT to do this is acceptable.
- Trainees should be freed up from commitments and be able to attend. A register is taken at each day. The only exception for absence is annual leave. Other reasons for absence need to be brought to the attention of the TPD. Less than full time trainees need to attend a proportionate amount of training days to their LTFT status and this needs to be planned with their educational supervisor. Post FRCEM ST6s are welcome to attend and should also be involved in planning / running the days.
- Feedback will be taken on each session to optimise future sessions.
